Richmond Council Winter Fuel Grant Scheme

Many will be concerned about the changes to government winter fuel payments. Richmond Council will offer some extra support this winter:

• Fuel Grant Scheme - a payment of up to £170. Those still eligible for the Government winter fuel payment can also apply for the Council's Fuel Grant Scheme which will be open for applications between 2 December 2024 - 17 January 2025.

In addition,

• £100 will be offered to all pensioners who receive a Council Tax Reduction, but who are not eligible for the government's winter fuel payments.



Remember to **check if you are entitled to the government Pension Credit** - it could be worth on average £3,900 per year for those who are over the State Pension Age (66+ years).
